Conspiracy Theorist Convention Cancelled Over Accusations Of Mind Control by Secret FBI Elvis Cult

"Seekers By The Sea", billed as the largest gathering of conspiracy buffs in the world, has been cancelled. The event, which had been planned for April 17-19, 2009 at Bayshore Park in San Leon, was to be a 3 day festival. According to Zarvin Mindler, President of the Grassy Knoll Abductees, the event is "not going to fuckin happen."

Over 40 groups had planned to attend the festival, but representatives were unable to work together. Agent Elvis, a group who believes that Elvis is alive and working undercover for the FBI, accused one of the other groups of using mind control. Houston Cops cleared by Grand Jury in alleged "Homicide"

A Harris County grand jury has cleared 12 cops who fired over 400 rounds of ammunition at an unarmed pregnant Hispanic teenager in March, killing her.

Marcia Salliza, 17, was gunned down by police officers investigating a bold daytime loitering incident. Officers claimed the girl brandished what appeared to be a gun, but later turned out to be a helium-filled balloon that said "Happy Birthday" on it. The balloon was a gift intended for Salliza's mother. The teen also reportedly used a "gang hand sign" once last year.

Although the County Medical Examiner ruled the case a homicide, the Assistant District Attorney Betty Getzoff did not press the Grand Jury for an indictment. After the verdict, attorneys for the officers stated that justice had been done.

Witnesses who testified were outraged at the verdict. According to eyewitness Joe Camell, several of the officers stopped to reload and then resumed firing at the unarmed dying girl. He told the court that one of them even peed on her after she was handcuffed and not moving.

The incident began when an anonymous caller told police that "something weird was happening". The dispatcher asked "Where?", and the mysterious caller replied, "All over the place".

At this point, the dispatcher notified all units to be on the lookout for something weird happening everywhere. Within moments, patrol officers spotted Salliza and initiated a confrontation. Because Salliza spoke only a few phrases in English learned from school, she was unfamiliar with the term "freeze bitch o' riley shoot!" Not comprehending the unfamiliar slang words, she continued walking down the sidewalk, and the officers were forced to open fire. Salliza, who had sang that morning in the choir at Our Lady of the Insolent Rejoinder, died moments later. Salliza is the 14th unarmed pregnant Hispanic female teenager accidentally killed by police this year in Harris County. A class-action lawsuit filed by LULAC was recently thrown out of court after the judge ruled that attorneys had failed to capitalize some words.

Escaped Psychopathic Killer Sought by Local Authorities

Area police agencies are on the lookout for an escaped psychopathic killer who was last seen nearby as recently as yesterday, lurking near some houses.
